

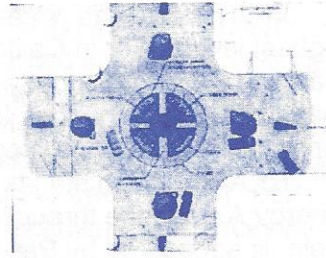

New Council Takes Oath of Office

On November 7th, 3,999 Riverbank residents went to the election polls to cast ballots for candidates and various issues and referendums. Locally William O'Brien was elected Mayor, and incumbents Curtis Lineberger and Dave White were re-elected to four year terms. Because Mayor O'Brien's election created a vacancy on the Council,

Louie Perez, long time Riverbank resident was unanimously appointed to fill the opening at the December 11, 2000 Council Meeting.

The new Council will move forward in formulating the best policies to improve the quality of life for all the residents of Riverbank.
